Purpose

To assist in the general effective operation of the research facility; this will include basic maintenance, stock checking, specialist cleaning and data logging.

Main duties and responsibilities

- To assist with activities within specialist research facility.
- To replenish supplies to ensure that adequate stock levels are maintained.
- Undertake laboratory housekeeping; cleaning and maintenance of standards in specialist areas including glassware and waste processing and disposal. This may include using equipment such as autoclaves and glasswashers.
- Monitoring of environments where research is being undertaken.
- To log routine data such as temperatures or ensure items used for research are recorded.
- To work in accordance with University Health and Safety guidelines and to fulfil roles such as fire warden or first aider.
- Any other duties, as defined by the line manager that do not change the general character of the job or the level of responsibility entailed.

The post holder will organise themselves and work independently on a day to day basis under the guidance of senior technicians and/or Technical Manager.
